### How to refer



#### Rheumatology

Who can be referred?

- Adults ages 18+
- Confirmed or highly suspected rheumatologic condition.
- Conditions not evaluated are unspecified pain, swelling, chronic fatigue, fibromyalgia, multiple
  joint pain, osteoarthritis, myalgia, arthralgia, DJD, non-inflammatory back pain, hypermobility
  syndromes, and osteoporosis.

# Work-up What is required?

Chart notes supporting a specific rheumatologic condition, current (within six months) lab work up required

#### Known psoriasis with concern for psoriatic arthritis

- Required labs/evaluation:
  - Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - o C-reactive protein (CRP)

**Refractory gout** (gout that has not responded to urate lowering therapy or with severe, tophaceous disease)

- o Please include prior medication trials, doses in consult request
  - o Required labs/evaluation:
    - Serum uric acid
    - o Comprehensive metabolic panel
    - o CBC with differential

#### Small Joint arthritis (hands and feet).

Example diagnoses: RA, Sjogrens, psoriatic arthritis, lupus

- Required labs/evaluation:
  - o Rheumatoid factor RF
  - o Anti-cyclic citrullinated peptide (CCP or ACPA)
  - o Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - o C-reactive protein (CRP)

#### Large joint arthritis (eg knees, hips, shoulders)

Example diagnoses: RA, PMR, gout, pseudogout, psoriatic arthritis, other spondyloarthritis

- o Required labs/evaluation:
  - o Rheumatoid factor RF
  - o Anti-cyclic citrullinated peptide (CCP or ACPA)
  - Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - o C-reactive protein (CRP)
  - o Uric acid

**Inflammatory back pain** (worse with rest, improves with activity, typically in patient <50 years old)

Example diagnoses: Ankylosing spondylitis, Inflammatory bowel disease related

- Required labs/evaluation:
  - o Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - o C-reactive protein (CRP)
  - o HLA-B27

### How to refer



Rash/skin changes plus arthritis or other systemic features -- if rash only, please discontinue and place dermatology consult).

Example diagnoses: Lupus, Sjogrens, MCTD, scleroderma, psoriatic arthritis

- o Required labs/evaluation:
  - Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - C-reactive protein (CRP)
  - o ANA by IFA with profile

#### Inflammatory muscle disease (muscle weakness with or without rash)

Example diagnoses: Dermatomyositis, polymyositis

- o Required labs/evaluation:
  - Creatine phosphokinase (CPK)
  - o Aldolase
  - o AST
  - o ALT
  - o Lactate dehydrogenase
  - o Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - C-reactive protein (CRP)

#### Constitutional symptoms or multi-organ dysfunction concerning for Vasculitis

Example diagnoses: Giant cell/Temporal arteritis, ANCA associated vasculitis, IgA vasculitis

- o Required labs/evaluation:
  - Erythrocyte sedimentation rate (ESR)
  - C-reactive protein (CRP)
  - o ANCA antibodies (p-ANCA, c-ANCA, MPO, PR3)
  - ANA by IFA with profile
