Award descriptions

Winners will be announced during the awards ceremony. Because of the virtual nature of Research Day, winners will receive their physical awards at a later date.

Best Presentations Award

Podium presentations are evaluated on overall delivery of information as well as the quality and originality of the research conducted. One winner will be selected in each category: Work in Progress; Completed Work; Quality Improvement; and Patient & Community Engagement.

Outstanding Research Investigator of the Year Award

One research investigator will be recognized for their body of work, impact on patient care and research leadership during the past year. This award takes into consideration the high level of commitment and work required in community-based research. MultiCare's researchers serve in multiple roles as health care providers, first and foremost, with an added role and commitment to advancing health care for patients across the country. Recognition is intended for investigators who go above and beyond their everyday research role in the following ways:

High level of engagement and investment.

- Spends time with colleagues and patients educating and encouraging research
- Devotes time to meeting with sponsors and staff
- Teaches and mentors staff
- Is available to research staff and sponsors
- Is proactive with their research portfolio, ensuring diversification, funding and feasibility
- Is responsive to inquiries and requests by staff in an engaging way

Passion for research and the impact research has on patients, clinic team, organization and community.

- Demonstrates research passion through advocacy within health care system and community
- Networks and collaborates with other researchers and sponsors
- Maintains a clinical practice and commits time to research
- Builds relationships with patients and their families
- Mentors staff
- Seeks out research opportunities requiring time outside of clinic to write grants, meet with sponsors and conduct study visits
- Appreciation of research staff

Diane Cecchettini Excellence in Research Award

Created in 2015, this award commemorates an exemplary 25-year legacy of service at MultiCare Health System. Diane Cecchettini served as president and CEO of MultiCare from July 1999 to May 2014. Under her leadership, MultiCare grew to include five hospitals, 10,000 employees and an expansive community outpatient treatment network.

In addition to Cecchettini's unquestioned legacy at MultiCare, she was also an ardent supporter of research and the driving force behind the creation of the MultiCare Institute for Research & Innovation in its current form.

She facilitated the investment needed to allow the research programs at MultiCare to grow and prosper in a somewhat nontraditional environment — a community-hospital system. She was also a personal contributor to research program development, becoming one of the first charter members of the MultiCare Society, benefiting research and innovation. This personal philanthropic commitment was a notable spark that helped ignite our now robust donor-funded, investigator-initiated research program.

This is a competitive award honoring excellence and high achievements accomplished through the teamwork of MultiCare employees and their private, academic or industry partners in the community.

- Research efforts that best exemplify and further the mission and vision of MultiCare
- Exceptional leadership
- Research discovery in medicine and science on the local, national and international level
- Exemplary community health research that translates into direct improvement in patient outcomes
- Interdisciplinary teams working collaboratively to advance medical science and patient care
- Developing best leadership practices to improve patient care and safety
- Significant and lasting contributions to the field of health services research
- Role model for the MultiCare values



















The Research Institute

MultiCare has been conducting clinical research studies for 40 years, initially focusing on the area of oncology. Over time, the research program expanded to include a portfolio of Phase I-IV clinical studies spanning a diverse array of diseases and medical conditions. The MultiCare Institute for Research & Innovation, formed in 2010, gathered all the research efforts in our health care system into a single program.

The Research Institute conducts both clinical trials and outcomes-based research with MultiCare-employed physicians, allied health care providers and physicians practicing independently in the community. We participate in research through a number of mechanisms including federal, industry and investigator-initiated studies.
